Our aim is to nurture and empower future lawyers who will use their skills to strengthen justice and the communities they serve.

## THE COLLEGE OF LAW COMMUNITY JUSTICE BURSARY

The Community Justice Bursary is available to eligible students commencing the PLT Program, or students who intend to commence the PLT program within the next 12 months. The Bursary covers students working part-time or full-time and enrolment in any PLT course offered by the College. It reduces the cost of the PLT course by half for eligible recipients, making the transition to legal practice more financially accessible for those serving in the community legal sector.

Applicants must meet the following requirements at the time of application:

Be a domestic student

Applicants must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident.

Be a final-year law student or law graduate.

Be employed in any role legal or non-legal - at a community law organisation that includes but is not limited to:

- A Community Legal Centre
- · An Office of the Director of **Public Prosecutions** 
  - A Legal Aid office
- · An indigenous legal service

**Applicants must submit** their application before enrolling in their course.

  - 2. Proof of completed or final-year law studies, and
- 3. Proof of status as a domestic student in Australia (e.g. Australian citizenship certificate, passport, or evidence of permanent residency).
